Why Change?	To support UBC's strategic goals, improve security and compliance, enhance scalability, and meet fiscal responsibilities, UBC is optimizing licensing costs while enhancing accessibility and collaboration through web-based tools.	
What's	Some groups will move from the desktop (A3) version of M365 to the online	
Changing?	(A1) version, enabling access to M365 apps online and via mobile.	
	Exceptions to this may incur faculty/department costs.	
Who's Impacted?	Non-Salaried Clinical Faculty and Service Workers who do not rely on their computer to perform most of their daily tasks, will be transitioned to the A1 license. Emeriti will receive an Email-only license. All others will remain on the A3 license.	
When's the Change?	These changes will need to be completed by the end of March 2025.	

Which M365 package am I eligible for?

Licenses are assigned based on roles:

Non-Salaried Clinical Faculty and Service Workers who do not rely on their computer to perform most of their daily tasks, will receive the A1 license. All other staff, faculty, students, and student employees will be assigned an A3 license. Emeriti will receive an email-only license.

Postdoctoral Fellows (Externally Funded)	Postdoctoral fellows are individuals who have completed a doctoral degree and who are seeking the opportunity to train further in a particular area of research. A postdoctoral fellow is an award recipient where the individual is awarded a competitive fellowship from an external granting agency, which may or may not be paid through UBC, or receives financial support from a sponsoring agency. Award recipients don't have under the mentorship of a supervising faculty member at UBC. (UBC HR)	
Emeriti with Post Retirement Appointment	A former employee of the University who retired or resigned while holding tenured appointment as a Professor, Professor of Teaching, Associate Professor, Assistant Professor, Senior Instructor or a confirmed appointment as a General Librarian, Administrative Librarian, Program Director, Clinical Professor, or Clinical Associate Professor, and who has been granted Emeriti Status by the UBC Senate, and holds a postretirement term appointment. (UBC Senate)23	Employee must have an appointment that is currently Active, and an employee Status of Active, Future Hire, or On-Leave.
